

What is the Role of a Clinical Consolidation Expert (CCE)?

Clinical Consolidation Experts (CCEs) are experienced Nurse Practitioners who provide targeted, clinical mentorship to other NPs across the province through the NNPBC Mobile Skills Team (MST). The CCE role is grounded in peer-to-peer knowledge sharing, skill reinforcement, and confidence building for clinical practice.

Who Can Be a CCE?

A Clinical Consolidation Expert is:

- An NP with extensive clinical experience in primary care practice
- Recognized as a Subject Matter Expert (SME) in their field
- Committed to advancing NP practice through mentorship and coaching
- Supported by NNPBC to provide timely and responsive clinical skills support

What Do CCEs Do?

CCEs provide:

- Clinical consolidation support for new grads and/or transitioning NPs
- Guidance on clinical decision-making, procedural skills, and documentation
- Case-based learning and reflective practice opportunities
- A safe and supportive environment to ask questions and grow clinical confidence



Why Does It Matter?

- Ensure quality and consistency in NP clinical skills across BC
- Reduce professional isolation
- Enhance peer mentorship and lifelong learning
- Promote safe, effective, and person-centered care
- Contribute to NP retention and wellness
