Her clinical practice background is focused on perinatal and public health nursing. She is a member of the Canadian federal CNO Advisory Committee on Nursing Retention and chairs the International Council of Nurses' PAHO region Global Nursing Leadership Institute Alumni Network as well as the ICN GNLI Global Steering Group. She is also the co-founder of the Island Health Innovation Lab and Code Hack and serves as a member of the Canadian Nurses Association Board of Directors. Angela has held a variety of leadership positions and is an active practicing nurse across all four domains of nursing practice. Angela advises and speaks around the world on nursing leadership, nurse-led innovation, clinical governance, policy science, trauma-informed leadership, and health-care transformation.

As a white settler of French and Scottish ancestry, Angela lives with her partner and two sons on the beautiful homelands of the Lekwungen speaking peoples, the Songhees and Esquimalt First Nations, in what is colonially known today as Victoria, BC.
