Nurse Practitioner Opportunity at BC Cancer – Abbotsford – Pain and Symptom Management

At BC Cancer, Nurse Practitioners collaborate with clients and other health professionals to identify and assess trends and patterns that have implications for clients, families, and communities; develop and implement population and evidence-based strategies to improve health; and participate in policy-making activities that influence health services and practices. As professionals, they participate in peer and self-review to evaluate the outcome of their services at the client, community, and population level. They are responsible for their professional development and maintaining competence and registration as a nurse practitioner.

In this patient-centred practice, the NP works autonomously within a collaborative team to provide care for patients who have complex care needs related to pain and symptom management throughout the continuum, from cancer diagnosis to palliative care. The NP works closely with other team members to address patient issues on a day to day basis, including managing care in clinical follow-up, providing urgent care, and liaising with and providing outreach to primary care providers.
