Application Prompts

As part of the application process, you will be required to respond to stream-specific prompt questions.

There are three (3) application streams based on your current stage of education:

- **High School:** You are currently in high school and have been accepted to a nursing education program in BC
- **Undergraduate:** You are currently enrolled in an undergraduate nursing program (LPN, RN, or RPN) in BC
- **Graduate:** You are enrolled in a graduate-level nursing program in BC, including NP programs or another graduate nursing program (MN/MSN, PhD)

This guide is provided so you can review the prompts and prepare your answers ahead of time. We encourage you to prepare your responses in advance, as your progress cannot be saved once you begin the online form.

You may submit your responses in one of the following formats. Only one (1) format is required:

- Written (maximum 3000 characters [approximately 500 words])
- Audio (maximum 5 minutes, 25 MB, in .mp3 or .wav format). You may upload 1 recording only.
- Video (maximum 5 minutes, 25 MB, 720p, in .mp3 or .avi format). You may upload 1 video only.

Tell us about a time you noticed something in the health care system that wasn't working well for patients, families, or communities. What questions did it raise for you about how care could look different?

Graduate Applicant Question
